The Young Entrepreneur Hall of Fame was established for the purpose of enshrining great ideas and accomplishments of America's youth in entrepreneurship. The Hall of Fame annually inducts up to three young entrepreneurs in grades K-12. In this way the Young Entrepreneur Hall of Fame is taking the great entrepreneurial accomplishments of American youth and preserving them forever in order to inspire future generations of youth.

Sponsorship Opportunities

- I. **Exclusive Naming Rights:** A corporation may sponsor the entire national Young Entrepreneur Hall of Fame program and use the name of their choice.
